## **Dog Exclusion**

Exclusion of dogs from defined children's play areas, multi-use games areas (MUGAs) and tennis courts

Dogs are currently excluded from any children's play area that contains children's play equipment such as slides, swings, climbing frames and similar apparatus and that is enclosed on all sides by fences, gates, walls or other structures that mark the boundary of the play area.

Dogs are also excluded from any partially or fully enclosed sports area (commonly known as a multi-use games area or MUGA) and from tennis courts. There is an exemption to any exclusion requirement for registered assistance dogs.

Dogs on leads  Dogs to be placed on leads if requested by an authorised officer – applies across the
whole borough The council recognises that the vast majority of dog owners are responsible and keep their dogs under control while they are out. Dogs that are considered to be not under proper control are subject to this part of the Order. The current maximum fine for a Fixed Penalty Notice is £100 and up to £1000 on prosecution.
The proposal is therefore that the person in control of a dog should put the dog on a lead if requested to do so by an authorised officer. Authorised officers will carry appropriate identification.

<u>Length of lead to be specified in the Order</u>

Section for landowners or managers
Landowners and land managers should be aware that where any PSPO is in place, the order will apply on any public land and any land to which the public have access, unless a specific exemption applies. The only current specific exemption is land at the disposal of the Forestry Commissioners.
Town and Parish Councils should note that they do not have the power to introduce Public Spaces Protection Orders and the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government has stated that Byelaws dealing with dog control issues will not be confirmed. This means that Town and Parish Councils are not able to impose additional measures for dog control on their land and the only enforceable restrictions are those detailed in the Cheshire West and Chester Public Spaces Protection Orders.
However, any landowners, including Parish and Town Councils, can decide that any or all PSPO provisions are not enforceable on their land.
