





From a Horton Green garden

Fallen, rotting tree trunks by our stream are a haven for two baby robins, which fledged early but are doing well. A mallard and drake are quite at home by the stream. We stroll round the garden, listening and watching for nesting sites where birds go with beaks bulging with moths, twigs and feathers. Our log store has a blackbird nest just above a robin's. A mistlethrush nests in our cherry tree, easily spotted by blue plastic swinging from it! Sparrows nest in the thorny pyracantha, blackbirds in a hydrangea and baby birds do well on the lawn daily. Particular favourites are two baby female blackbirds, relentlessly chasing their Dad for food but now finding their own worms. Three hares run amok across the fields. As they come close to the potting shed, they are a joy to see. I didn't realise they were so big.



Tilston Parish Council Report - June 2021

Hill Field

The development of Hill Field continues to be a priority for the Parish Council. The plans for the layout for the carpark area immediately behind the Hall are now drawn up and ready for the next stage of consultations with other outside bodies. Good progress is being made on the development of the rest of the field for all the local community to use and enjoy. Recently there has been a meeting on site with a representative of the Mersey Forest Scheme and local residents. Possibilities of planting a significant number of trees through the Mersey Forest Scheme, and other options involving not



so many new trees but more open space were looked at. The most suitable options, which of course will have to take into account how the field is managed and what the maintenance costs will be, are being discussed in follow up meetings with the intention that a firm plan agreeable to residents of the village will be in hand to start implementing in the autumn.

Bins

CWAC recently held a public consultation regarding the future of bin collections. The Parish Council responded by pointing out that if the 'free' collection of green waste was withdrawn or reduced that could well lead to more trips to recycling centres, which would not be good for the environment as a whole, and fly-tipping. It would also mean that people with only a little garden waste would either have to pay the full annual amount or find another way of disposing of their small amount of green waste. However, despite efforts by our Ward Councillor Paul Roberts, CWAC have now decided that the Green garden waste bins will no longer be included in standard waste collection: there will be a charge of £40 for each green bin, which will be collected on a fortnightly basis from March though till November. The two recycling boxes will be replaced by wheelie bins, each the same size as the current black ones. These will be collected fortnightly rather than the present weekly collections. Food bins and black bin collection will remain unchanged.

Planning Appeal

The Stables, Duckington Lane The appeal against the refusal to grant planning permission for the conversion of the redundant equestrian building in the open countryside near the top of Duckington Lane/Hobb Hill to two residential buildings has been refused. The refusal is on the grounds that the character of the building would fail to reflect the rural characteristic of the area in a visually prominent location, and the building is not capable of such conversion without major reconstruction or significant loss of existing fabric. The Parish Council had opposed the grant of planning permission on both these grounds.

Glamping Pods

The wet winter months have meant that it has taken longer than expected for the planning conditions regarding archeological investigations to be carried out, but these have now been fulfilled and progress can be made. The first part to be developed is the cafe and coffee roasterie, and if all goes to plan these will be open to some extent by Christmas

Parish Council Meetings

Government regulations now require that Parish Council meetings are held in person, so from now on meetings will once again be in the War Memorial Hall, and you will be very welcome.



Each day there will be cycling on offer (see below,) all cyclists must have a suitable bike, helmet & footwear. No need to sign up for sessions, we will sort the children into groups on arrival. They may be able to cycle all morning or will share their time with other activities.

All cycling sessions will be led by qualified Learn to Ride coaches assisted by young leaders.

All other activities will be led by a qualified dance teacher, sports leader or young coach.

There will be TPFA adults overseeing the mornings. Equipment will be cleaned at the end of each morning and sanitiser will be available, which children will be asked to use before participating. If your child is displaying any Covid-19 symptoms, they should not attend and must follow Government guidance. Please notify a TPFA adult of any medical issues we should be aware of.

It's been an exciting month for the Bellringers at St Mary's, we have restarted our practise nights on Thursdays, maintaining the requirements for Covid so only up to 6 ringers can be in attendance, but this has included some additional ringers from Tattenhall who kindly come and fill in for those who are missing, we do the same at Tattenhall when asked.

The last two weeks, we have been practicing some specific ringing on 4 bells and learning a few of the sequences (known as methods) to challenge our ringers, but we also have been working on getting our timing better (called Striking), if you listen on a Thursday night or Sunday morning, then we hope you will be able to notice! We also have introduced a few ringing challenges changing the sequence of the bells in larger "jumps", this helps with bell control, something we need to do having not done very much ringing for that past 15 months.

On Saturday 12th June, you may have noticed some extended ringing, this was a band of 6 ringers from Malpas, Chester Cathedral, and further afield, who got together to ring two full peals, the first in St Oswald's, Malpas in the morning and then after lunch at the Carden Arms, (excellent fish and chips I am led to believe!) they came to St Mary's to complete what was over 5 hours of ringing in total that day to celebrate the Queens official birthday.

For those of you who are not aware, a full peal consists of over 5000 changes, a change being a sequence of 6 bells. This is a feat that many can only aspire to as it takes considerable mental stamina to ring each of these from memory, crib sheets are not allowed!

We are delighted that some of St Mary's ringers that have taken a break for a few years are now returning to ring and it was great to see that even a break of 6 years for Nicky was no problem and she rang for the service on Sunday 13th.

There has been a lot of work carried out in the Belfry at St Mary's at the start of the year, all the frame for the bells has been stripped and painted and all the wheels have been restored to their original condition. A booklet outlining the work has been printed to raise money, these are available for a small donation for anyone who is interested from the Church, the Tower Captain, Jill Farmer (01829 250471) or any of the Bell Ringers

The extension to the lockdown was confirmed this week, but we are planning to arrange some open days or evenings after 19th July for anyone who wants to go up the tower and have a look at the belfry and then have a go at ringing a bell, we will put these in the Reporter when we have confirmed dates.

PATIENTS MATTER

The Rural Alliance Primary Care Network (RAPCN) Primary

Care Networks (PCNs) were created as a key part of the NHS Long Term Plan in 2019 to bring GP practices together to work at scale and provide a wider range of services to patients. There are 9 PCNs across Cheshire, each covering a population of c30-50,000 patients.

Malpas Surgery works in partnership with 5 other rural practices which form the Rural Alliance PCN. These practices are Bunbury, Kelsall, Tarporley (Adey& Dancy), Tarporley (Campbell) and The Village Surgeries Group. This alliance, encompassing approximately 40,000 patients, aims to offer more personalised and co-ordinated health and social care to our local population by working collaboratively with other health, social care and voluntary sector services to tackle common issues and share knowledge and resources.

The RAPCN is governed by a Board led by the PCN clinical director Dr. Alistair Adey and chaired by Dr. Andy Campbell. Each practice has a seat on the board for their nominated practice clinician and all decisions are agreed and/or voted on by the group. The Board, which meets monthly also consists of the 6 Practice Managers and representatives from the wider health community. The PPGs are represented at these meetings by one of the 6 PPG Chairs in rotation.

A number of additional roles have already been created – with more to follow - to support our patients across the whole RA which include:-

<u>The RA Social Prescribing Team</u> – who can help people make positive changes in their lives to make them feel better. They give people time to talk about how they feel and work together to provide a solution; whether that's access to counselling, joining a community group, signposting for debt and money worries or even just providing a listening ear. These are:

<u>Social Prescribing Link Workers</u> – Claire & Lindsay – can help unpick non-medical issues that may affect health, wellbeing and low level mental health issues offering practical and emotional support to people over the age of 16.

<u>Wellbeing Co-ordinators</u> – Amanda & Willow - run by Primary Care Cheshire (GP Federation), and is specifically aimed at patients over the age of 18 who have one or more long term condition and have a social need.

<u>Brightlife Co-ordinator</u> – **Donna &**—**Julie** work with local agencies from across the voluntary, public & private sectors to reduce loneliness and social isolation amongst the over 50s.

<u>First Contact Physiotherapist</u> – Emma Perry & Ruth Court – have advanced skills to enable them to assess, diagnose and recommend appropriate treatment or referral on a patient's first visit to the surgery. Clinical Pharmacists – newly recruited for Tarporley Adey, Tarporley Campbell, Malpas and VSG, the recruitment programme continues for Kelsall & Bunbury. The Pharmacists can assess, evaluate and advise on the appropriateness & effectiveness of patient's medication. If you think you could benefit from any of these services, please speak to any practice staff member who will be pleased to help you.

What do you make and how do you make it?

We are a pottery and furniture small business. Anna is the potter who hand throws pots on her pottery wheel. Dan is the furniture maker who designs and manufactures our signature collection and bespoke fitted furniture.

How long have you been making?

We set up Forest & Clay over a year ago but we have both been creatively making for a while now.

What do you love most about what you do?

Anna: Pottery is so therapeutic, being on the wheel is definitely my favourite part of the making process. Opening a kiln after a glaze firing is also one of the best parts, pottery can be unpredictable sometimes but exciting and rewarding as well. Dan: The gluing process is the best part as you have all these separate components that are joined to make one piece. It is so rewarding taking the clamps off and really seeing the product take shape and the beauty of the raw wood.

What are your favourite things to make?

Anna: Probably mugs as I love attaching the handles part. I find fiddly work so much fun. Dan: The circular coffee table is my favourite design (currently) and product I like to make as routing the circle is so satisfying.

What does a general day in the life look like to you?

Anna: Everyday is different which is brilliant for me, so I could spend a whole day throwing on the wheel or I break my day up with trimming the half dry pots to neaten them up and prepare them if they need handles. Glazing is fairly time consuming as there a few stages where you have to wait around so in between there are a few studio jobs that are needed to be done like reclaiming my clay (recycling bits of waste clay into ready to use clay) or packaging up orders. Some days we will set up our new products to be photographed (I love this part as I studied photography as Uni). Dan: Usually I spend the morning designing and the afternoon in the workshop completing orders and testing new ideas. The days can be varied from producing something from our signature collection, wholesale orders or a bespoke client order.


