



Little Pigs we decided to make some pink pig playdough using pink marshmallows. The children


really enjoyed squishing the mixture between their fingers.

ATTRACTING BATS

Bats fly in sheltered spots on calm, dry evenings around dusk, particularly near water where insects swarm. Place bat boxes high on walls or trees. The noctule emerges first, recognised by its direct flight and sudden swoops. Pipistrelles fly erratically.

AND ANOTHER WORD FOR OUR HEDGES

Our oldest hedges are remnants of ancient wildwood, left when Bronze Age farmers first cleared the land. Some Tilston and Shocklach hedgerows can be dated 600 years back to the Middle Ages. We should preserve and develop hedges because the benefits are enormous, including windbreaks and water sinks, conserving the soil. They are homes for insects which pollinate our crops. They shelter wild animals and livestock, adding diversity to their diet, as well as ours. They also gather and hold carbon. All these advantages from something that is such a beautiful part of the landscape.

POLLINATING CHESHIRE

This Cheshire Wildlife Trust project aims to restore 250 acres of species-rich grassland. Surveys are being completed, seeds collected from local donor sites and seedlings nurtured for planting this Autumn. So far, 23 acres have been restored with 3,500 wildflowers. 3,736 growers have refused bee killing pesticides.

Banning peat compost is the latest Wildlife Trusts campaign. Peat bogs capture more carbon than forests and are special habitats.

TILSTONS TRAILS, PAST AND PRESENT

In Earlier times, deciding the direction of travel was not simple. This area was part of a vast broad-leafed forest (Delamere being a remnant) and location skills were essential from childhood. The clues remain, though we tend not to notice them. Stinging nettles prefer fertile soil and show us we are near human habitation. Trees have more foliage on their south side. We can use our shadows for orientation. Animal tracks, puddles and cloud formations all offer helpful pointers to the lost. Today, you can also find Tilston Trail leaflets in the shop, pub and church.





Local historian, **David Hayns**' article is published in the latest 'Cheshire History', the journal of the CLHA. It gives the fascinating real stories behind Shocklach church records. One tale is 'Beating the Bounds' to confirm boundaries. Typically 24 males would consume 11s 0d of meat and drink. Not just damson gin, then.



Christmas is on the horizon, and the Bells at St Mary's are getting more and more use as our "New Recruits" are progressing in their training. We are holding practices on Thursday nights as usual for the whole band and our welcome visitors as well as a two hour session on a Sunday afternoon for the new learners where we tie the clappers on the bells and practice either silently or using the Simulator, a few of us also continue to visit our friends at St Albans, Tattenhall on a Tuesday, visiting other towers is always both fun and educational, and we have also had visitors at our practices from Handbridge and Hoole.

Individual training sessions are also happening during the week to accelerate the progress of our intermediate ringers, and these are also meaning that the whole band Is progressing.

It's always good to have some younger ringers and currently we have two that have made very quick progress, Cameron and Joseph both got the hang of the basics really well and I expect it will only be a few weeks before they join the main band to practice, this is quite a jump after learning how to handle a bell on your own, but we have every confidence that they will continue to progress and will probably overtake us all in double quick time!

We are looking at the possibility of ringing a Quarter Peal at Tilston in December with half of the band from our own ringers, Jo has now completed a couple of these 45 minute long sequences on the Simulator during the Sunday Learners sessions (we now have the ability to have two simulators running at the same time doing different things) and if Jill can find a few hours to do the same we will be in a good position to have a bash at completing the task with the help of some other local expertise as always!

Who has seen the new Church Website www.tilstonandshocklachchurch.co.uk? There is a quite big information section for bellringing now including a video tower tour including footage of the bells in the belfry when ringing, and lots of information about how and why we ring, if you get a minute have a look, you may feel inspired to "have a go" and we are always happy to let people do exactly that.

There will be quite a lot of service ringing this month being the festive season, and if all goes to plan, we are also going to have some special things happening in the tower whilst we are ringing in the dark evenings to brighten things on the run up to Christmas – I will say no more!

We like to give you some interesting Bellringing facts each month so this time we decided to tell you a bit about the bells themselves and a special kind of recycling!

We have 6 bells made by John Taylor & Co in Loughborough, they are still going today and when our bells were cast in 1924 this was a "purple period" for the foundry when some of the best Taylors bells were cast. They are made of Bell Metal which is an alloy of copper and tin with a tin content up to 25%, When our bells were cast, the original 4 Bells originally cast in 1672 and 1678 were removed from the tower and taken to the foundry where they were smashed and the metal reused to cast our 4 biggest bells, so in other words, the old bells were recycled to make four of the ones we have now, two new smaller one were added to make the 6 at St Mary's.

To end, all the ringers would like to thank you, our audience, for your support and encouragement throughout the year, we are looking forward to 2022 when we plan even bigger and better things in the Tower!





LOWEST EVER NUMBER OF BUTTERFLIES RECORDED

The recent Big Butterfly Count showed the lowest UK numbers since the survey started 12 years ago – 14% down on last year. This year's weather has had a large impact on many species with fewer Small Tortoiseshells and Peacocks, though some such as Marbled Whites and Meadow Browns increased. The annual trend is still downward for these important indicators of the overall health of our environment. Landscape restoration and new wild spaces are essential to reverse this. COP26 INTERNATIONAL CLIMATE CONFERENCE

Whatever else it achieves, COP26 has raised awareness of the issues. Many are in our own hands. The Plantlife charity sent each UK MP a packet of wildflower seeds, reminding them that grasslands store 30% of the world's carbon, so restoring meadows is essential to limiting climate change.

AUTUMN BOUNTY




